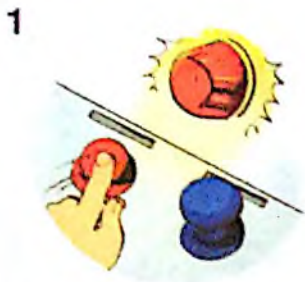

Everywhere we look, our lives are influenced by inventions—the cars we drive, the computers we use and the light bulbs that light our classrooms.

Some inventions make life easier. Can you imagine no air-conditioning during the summer, no cell phones to call your friends or no microwave ovens to make popcorn? Also, instead of walking everywhere, we can take a bike, a car, a motorcycle, a train, a boat, an airplane or a helicopter.

The most valuable sunken treasure ever found was on the ship called the S.S. Central America. In 1857 it sank during a hurricane. It was only discovered in 1986. It was carrying over 3 tons of gold, which is worth \$1.28 billion today!

Rainforests

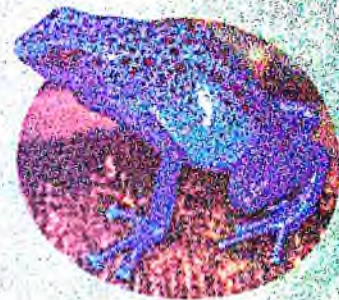
Have you ever been to a rainforest? Did you know they cover only 6 percent of the Earth's surface but supply 40 percent of the Earth's oxygen? Inside rainforests you will find all kinds of plants. Many of the plants are used to make medicines.



Rainforests are home to many exotic and mysterious animals. In southeast Asia you can find orangutans, gibbons, bluebirds and tigers. Did you know that tigers are good swimmers but poor climbers?

The art of self-defense

Do you like to watch action movies? It's amazing to watch the hero use his hands, feet and mind for self-defense. This kind of self-defense is called martial arts. Today many people learn martial arts for self-defense.

Throughout time people from many different countries have developed some form of self-defense. Boxing can be traced to the ancient Greek Olympics, while Chinese martial arts are 4,000 years old! Did you know there are almost 400 different styles of Chinese martial arts?

Time capsules: Keeping the past alive

Imagine you could communicate with someone 1,000 years from now. How would you do it? Well, you could use a time capsule!

A time capsule is a closed container with a collection of things. Inside you could put music CDs, pictures, books, maps or anything that shows who you are. Thousands of years into the future, people will open the time capsule to better understand how you lived.



Time capsules are put in different places. Some are buried in the ground or sent into space! The Golden Record is the first time capsule to be sent to space. It was sent out in 1977 on a satellite called Voyager I. It's now traveling past our solar system at 39,000 miles per hour. That's nearly 9 billion miles from Earth!

Another time capsule that will soon be sent into space is KEO. It contains messages from people from all over the world. The satellite will go around the Earth for 50,000 years. So, people in the year 52,009 will read these messages and learn about our world in 2009!
